Developed by researchers at the University of Chicago in the 1920s and 1930s, the theory of social disorganization states that crime is more likely to occur in communities with weak social control. Labeling theory - ³ Edwin Lemert has expanded the concepts of labeling theory, identifying two types of deviation that affect the form of identity. The primary deviation is a violation of norms that does not result in long-term effects on the self-image or interaction µ the individual with other people. Speed It's a deviant act, but getting a ticket at high speed usually doesn't make other people see you as a person, nor does it alter your own self³ concept. - Individuals who engage in primary deviation still maintain a sense of belonging to the society and are likely to remain in line with standards in the future. Secondary deviation occurs when a person's self-concept and behavior change after their μ are labeled as deviant by members of society. - The person can come to assume and fulfill the role of an "indicator" as an act of rebellion against the society that has labeled this individual as such.
